POST Perishable Skills 2020

Course Description:

This 24 hour course is designed to meet the POST Perishable Skills requirements for Driving, Domestic Violence Update, Firearms, Tactical Communications, and Arrest & Control. CPR/First Aid designed to meet Title 22 and P.C. 1318 (a) standards. These 3 days when taken together satisfy the POST 2 year CPT training requirement and several legislative mandates.
