Crisis Intervention Training for law enforcement was developed in 1988 by the Memphis, TN Police Department. The Memphis curriculum has since evolved to become a national model. Crisis Intervention Training was designed to give law enforcement officers the tools to more effectively respond to crises in the field by providing increased knowledge about mental health crisis, mental illness, the stigma associated with mental illness, and de-escalation strategies to avoid violent confrontations. While originally developed for law enforcement, Crisis Intervention Training is now commonly provided to EMS providers around the country with specialized mental health teams. American Ambulance has developed such a team and is offering this training to their Behavioral Health Support Team and is pleased to open the course to its law enforcement partners in the field.
