eye protection.

Recommended Equipment:

Bullet resistant vest, shotgun shell pouch and/or side saddle, sling attached with sling swivels, rain gear (seasonal), sunscreen, baseball or

'boonie' hat, knee and elbow pads, insect repellent, hydration system,

and water.

**Attire:** Attire is relaxed: jeans (in good condition), or suitable utility-type

clothing is acceptable. Shirts and hats may not contain offensive

language, logos, or otherwise be unprofessional. No shorts or open toe

footwear.
